Parish Pull Returns July 10, Continues Tradition of Community Giving

MARSHFIELD — One of Marshfield's most anticipated summer events will return to the Central Wisconsin State Fairgrounds on Friday, July 10, as organizers prepare for the 12th annual Marshfield Parish Pull.

McGiveron said during a recent appearance on Hub City Times Presents.

Past recipients have included organizations such as Cat's Cradle, Companion Day Services, House of Mercy, Mary's Place, Honor Flight, Opportunities Development Centers and local food pantries. Annual donations typically range from \$5,000 to \$10,000 per organization, with

approximately \$30,000 distributed to community causes last year alone.

The pull features modified trucks, tractors, semis, mini rods and garden tractors competing to see who can pull a weighted sled the farthest. Competitors travel from throughout Wisconsin as well as Minnesota, Iowa

and Illinois to participate. Organizers expect between 100 and 130 pulls during the evening event.

Competition begins at 7 p.m., although food service opens at 5 p.m. to accommodate attendees arriving early for dinner and seating. Admission is \$10 for adults, with reduced pricing for youth. Spectators may also purchase pit access to view the vehicles up close.

McGiveron credits the event's success to its volunteers and sponsors. Approximately 300 volunteers help operate ticket booths, concessions, merchandise sales, track operations and other event functions.

"If it wasn't for the volunteers and the sponsors, we would not have the event

that we have today," McGiveron said.

In addition to supporting local charities, proceeds from the Parish Pull have helped fund improvements at the Central Wisconsin State Fairgrounds. Organizers estimate they have contributed nearly \$100,000 toward facility upgrades, including drainage projects, lighting improvements, accessibility enhancements and infrastructure repairs.

Those interested in volunteering or sponsoring the event can contact organizers through the Marshfield Parish Pull Facebook page. Volunteers are welcome regardless of church affiliation, McGiveron said.

The 2026 Parish Pull will take place Friday, July 10, at the Central Wisconsin State Fairgrounds in Marshfield, continuing a tradition that has become both a summer attraction and a significant source of support for community organizations throughout the area.

For the convenience of Wood County property owners, a representative from the Wood County Treasurer’s Office will be available at Marshfield City Hall on Wednesday, July 22, 2026, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. to collect second installment property tax payments.

This in-person collection service is available for one day only and applies to Wood County properties only. Marathon County property owners should contact the Marathon County Treasurer’s Office regarding payment options.

Residents may also mail payments to the Wood County Treasurer’s Office in Wisconsin Rapids or use available online payment services.

Second installment property tax payments are due by July 31, 2026, to avoid penalties and interest.

Electric bikes are becoming more common in Marshfield, but not every electric-powered two-wheeled vehicle is legally classified as an e-bike in Wisconsin. State law recognizes three classes of e-bikes, each with specific speed limits and operating requirements.

Electric dirt bikes and other off-highway vehicles are subject to different laws and generally are not permitted on public streets, sidewalks, trails, or parks. Before you ride, take a moment to understand the differences, follow the

rules of the road, wear a helmet, yield to pedestrians, and ride responsibly.

Columbus Catholic Graduate Begins Journey at U.S. Naval Academy

MARSHFIELD, Wis. — Columbus Catholic High School graduate Davis Vinnedge of Spencer has officially begun one of the nation’s most demanding leadership programs after entering the United States Naval Academy as a member of the Class of



2030.

Vinnedge was inducted into the academy on June 25 during Induction Day in Annapolis, Maryland, where he joined approximately 1,200 incoming midshipmen selected from across the country. His arrival marks the beginning of Plebe Summer, an intensive six-week introduction to military life designed to prepare

first-year students for the academic, physical, and leadership challenges ahead.

Plebe Summer is a rigorous training period that immerses new midshipmen in the traditions and expectations of the Naval Academy. During the program, plebes have no access to television, movies, the internet, or music, and their cell phone use is strictly limited, allowing them to focus entirely on military training and personal development.

Throughout the summer, Vinnedge and his classmates will develop essential military skills, including seamanship, navigation, damage control, sailing, and operating yard patrol craft. They will also receive instruction in infantry drill and weapons training with 9 mm pistols and M-16 rifles while building the discipline, teamwork, and resilience expected of future naval officers.

The United States Naval Academy annually selects a highly competitive class of students who have demonstrated exceptional academic achievement, leadership potential, athletic ability, and commitment to service. Upon successfully completing the academy’s four-year program, graduates are commissioned as officers in either the United States Navy or the United States Marine Corps.

Vinnedge’s appointment to the Naval Academy represents a significant accomplishment for both him and the Columbus Catholic community. As he begins his journey toward becoming a commissioned officer, he joins a long tradition of leaders dedicated to serving the nation.

The Naval Academy, located in Annapolis, Maryland, has prepared officers for naval service since 1845 and remains one of the country’s premier military institutions.

Hillers' Flag Tradition Continues to Honor Veterans Across Central Wisconsin

MARSHFIELD, Wis. — For nearly three decades, Phil and Jill Hiller have led one of Central Wisconsin's most visible tributes to military veterans, placing thousands of American flags throughout Marshfield and surrounding communities each year in recognition

of those who have served.

During a recent episode of Heroes from Home, host Tom Buttke visited Hiller's Ace Hardware to discuss the long-running tradition, which began with a simple idea and 3,000 flags. Today, the project has expanded far beyond Marshfield, reaching communities including Pittsville, Greenwood, Loyal, Neillsville, Colby, Auburndale, and other surrounding areas.



“When we ordered 3,000 flags, we asked ourselves how we were ever going to get them all put out,” Jill Hiller recalled. Family members, friends, employees, and volunteers came together to make it happen, creating what would become a cherished community tradition.

Over the years, the effort has grown significantly. What once relied primarily on family volunteers now includes community members of all ages who help place flags throughout neighborhoods, parks, and roadways ahead of patriotic holidays. Volunteers are encouraged to stop by the hardware store, pick up flags, and help cover designated areas at their convenience.

The Hillers continue to welcome new volunteers each year. While the project traditionally began with a large volunteer gathering on a Sunday, the effort has evolved to accommodate busy schedules. Community members can now assist throughout the week by taking on territories large or small, whether walking, biking, or simply enjoying an evening outdoors while helping honor veterans.

According to the Hillers, support from volunteers and local businesses has been essential to the program's success. Many

area sponsors contribute financially to help purchase and maintain flags, allowing the tribute to continue growing year after year.

The project carries special meaning for the Hiller family. Phil Hiller's brothers served in the military, while Jill's father was a veteran. Their personal connections to military service have helped fuel their commitment to honoring veterans throughout the region.

During the interview, Buttke praised the Hillers for their dedication, noting that the annual display has become a powerful symbol of appreciation for those who served. He encouraged residents not only to recognize veterans during patriotic holidays but throughout the year.

“If you know they're a veteran, go up to them anytime and say thank you,” Buttke said. “They were away from their families, and that's a big sacrifice.”

The numbers behind the effort are impressive. Phil Hiller estimated that the project now averages approximately 10,000 flags each year. Over 30 years, that translates to roughly 300,000 flags displayed in honor of veterans across Central Wisconsin.

As the tradition continues, the Hillers say their greatest gratitude goes to the community members who have supported the effort over the years.

“We couldn't do what we do without the community,” Jill Hiller said. “We're very appreciative of everyone who helps and supports this cause.”

The annual flag display remains one of the area's most enduring demonstrations of patriotism and appreciation for military service, reminding residents of the sacrifices made by veterans and their families while bringing communities together in a shared act of gratitude.
