



Understanding Heart Failure: Sanford Health Marshfield Clinic Shares Hope, Treatment, and Support

Heart failure is a diagnosis that can sound overwhelming, but according to Sanford Health Marshfield Clinic experts, it does not mean the heart has stopped working. Instead, it means the heart is not pumping blood as efficiently as it should—a condition that can often be successfully managed with today's advanced treatments and ongoing care.

On the latest episode of Your Health Matters, host Laura Kibbel welcomed Jessica Geiger, Heart Failure Improvement Nurse Practitioner, to discuss what heart failure really means, who it affects, and how patients can continue living active and fulfilling lives.

realize, with approximately one in four adults expected to develop the condition during their lifetime. While the risk increases with age, heart failure can affect adults of all ages.

One of the biggest misconceptions, Geiger noted, is that heart failure is an immediate life-threatening event. In reality, it refers to changes in how well the heart pumps blood. Some patients have weakened heart muscle, while others have a heart that has become stiff and less able to fill properly. Both conditions require careful monitoring and treatment.

The discussion also highlighted the work of the Heart Failure Improvement Clinic, where nurse practitioners, registered nurses, and medical

visits.

One unique feature of the program is a dedicated nurse hotline, allowing patients experiencing symptoms such as shortness of breath, weight gain, or swelling to receive guidance before their condition worsens. In many cases, medications can be adjusted over the phone, while others may receive outpatient intravenous diuretic treatment—often preventing the need for an emergency room visit or hospital admission.

The clinic also uses telehealth technology to care for patients throughout Wisconsin. Through remote appointments at Sanford Health Marshfield Clinic locations, patients can meet virtually with heart failure specialists while nurses at their local clinic assist with examinations using digital stethoscopes, cameras, and other

assistants work alongside cardiologists and primary care providers to help patients manage their condition. The clinic focuses on optimizing medications, educating patients and families, monitoring symptoms, and helping reduce unnecessary hospital

advanced medical equipment. This approach allows patients to receive specialized care much closer to home.

Although heart failure cannot typically be cured, Geiger emphasized that modern medications and treatment options have dramatically improved patient outcomes. Many people experience fewer symptoms, enjoy a better quality of life, and live longer than ever before. Success depends on taking medications as prescribed, following a heart-healthy lifestyle, managing other medical conditions such as high blood pressure and diabetes, and staying in close communication with healthcare providers.

Patients are also encouraged to monitor their health by weighing themselves daily, watching for swelling, eating a heart-healthy diet that is lower in sodium, staying physically active when appropriate, and contacting their care team if symptoms begin to change. Early intervention often helps prevent more serious complications.

The episode serves as an encouraging reminder that while a diagnosis of heart failure may sound frightening, today's treatments, technology, and dedicated healthcare teams provide patients with more options than ever before to successfully manage the condition and continue enjoying life.

Wildwood Zoo Announces the Passing of Grant, 16-year-old White-tailed Deer Buck

Wildwood Zoo is saddened to share the passing of Grant, our 16-year-old white-tailed deer buck, who peacefully passed away earlier this week from age-related causes.

Born at Wildwood Zoo in the spring of 2010, Grant was one of the last white-tailed deer born at our facility. Throughout his life, he became a familiar face to visitors, helping connect guests with one of Wisconsin's most recognizable native wildlife species.



Despite his advanced age, Grant entered this summer's growing season appearing strong and healthy, showing only a slight loss of body condition that is common in older deer. One of his most remarkable features was his impressive antlers, which remained large and well-framed even in his senior years.

Animal care staff found Grant peacefully resting in one of his favorite bedding areas among the berms in his habitat, where he appeared to have passed quietly and comfortably. The appropriate tests were ran, and he came back negative for CWD.

White-tailed deer are Wisconsin's most abundant large mammal and have long been an important part of Wood County's landscape. After populations declined in the late 1800s due to overhunting and habitat loss, successful conservation efforts restored them throughout the state. Today, they remain one of Wisconsin's greatest wildlife conservation success stories.

Grant's long life reflects the excellent care provided by Wildwood Zoo's animal care team. We are grateful for the many years he spent as an ambassador for Wisconsin's native wildlife and for the memories he created with generations of visitors.

Chris Armstrong Discusses Priorities, Healthcare, and Government Accountability on Get to Know

MARSHFIELD — Chris Armstrong, a Democratic candidate for Wisconsin's 7th Congressional District, recently appeared on Get to Know, Marshfield Broadcasting's nonpartisan candidate interview program, where he discussed his background, reasons for seeking office, and the issues he believes are most important to residents of northern and western Wisconsin.

Armstrong, a resident of New Richmond in St. Croix County, shared his personal and professional

background, describing a career in information technology after studying astrophysics and mathematics. He has owned and operated an IT consulting business for more than three decades while raising a family in western Wisconsin.

Armstrong said his decision to run for Congress followed increased political involvement after the 2025 presidential inauguration. He explained that he began participating in local demonstrations and later volunteered with county Democratic organizations before deciding to enter the race.

He said conversations with community members encouraged him to seek public office, adding that he believes Congress should play a stronger role in addressing national issues.

When asked about his priorities for Wisconsin's 7th District, Armstrong identified three primary areas of focus.

First, he said he believes Congress should hold the current presidential administration accountable for its actions and argued that Congress must more actively exercise its constitutional responsibilities.

His second priority centered on healthcare. Armstrong expressed concern about rising healthcare costs, the future of Medicare and Medicaid funding, and access to medical care in rural communities.

His third priority focused on reducing costs for consumers through changes in federal trade policy, particularly by ending tariffs that he said contribute to higher prices.

Discussing the economy, Armstrong attributed many higher consumer costs to tariffs and international conflicts, saying those policies increase prices paid by American businesses and consumers.

The conversation then shifted to rural healthcare, where Armstrong described the challenges facing hospitals and clinics across northern Wisconsin. He pointed to workforce shortages, long travel distances for specialized medical care, and the need to recruit more healthcare professionals to rural communities.

On public safety, he discussed balancing law enforcement needs with individual civil liberties. He also expressed concerns regarding surveillance technologies and federal law enforcement policies.

He also emphasized the importance of affordable housing and childcare as factors that influence whether healthcare providers choose to live and work in rural Wisconsin.

Armstrong said farmers have shared concerns about rising input costs, including fuel and fertilizer, as well as labor shortages and international trade uncertainty. He said immigration reform and more stable trade policies could help address many of those challenges.

The candidate also highlighted the need for expanded broadband infrastructure across rural Wisconsin, comparing modern internet access to the federal government's historic investment in rural electrification.

Asked about education, Armstrong voiced support for technical colleges, apprenticeships, workforce training, and continued investment in educational opportunities, while acknowledging that education policy involves both state

Addressing the federal budget, Armstrong argued that increasing tax revenue from wealthy individuals and large corporations should be part of reducing long-term deficits.

He also said Congress should examine defense spending and review funding priorities while protecting programs such as Social Security, Medicare, and Medicaid.

Armstrong pledged to remain accessible if elected, saying he intends to regularly visit communities throughout the district, hold town halls, participate in virtual meetings, and maintain communication with constituents across the district's 26 counties.

In his closing remarks, Armstrong described himself as a political newcomer motivated by concern for future generations.

He said his campaign is driven by a desire to make a positive difference for his family and community, emphasizing that he wants to represent everyday
